

Julian Lloyd Webber enjoys one of the most creative careers in music today. As a solo cellist he has performed and recorded with many of the world's greatest orchestras and conductors. He has inspired over fifty new works for cello from a wide range of composers.

Julian Lloyd Webber founded the UK Government's In Harmony programme and Sistema England, introducing the power of music to more than 60,000 school children from the least privileged parts of England.

In 2014 Julian Lloyd Webber was forced to retire from playing the cello due to a neck injury. In 2015 he was appointed Principal of the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire where he remained for five years.

He continues to devote his energies to the helping young musicians at the start of their careers with his series 'Rising Stars' on Classic FM and Sky Arts TV.
